



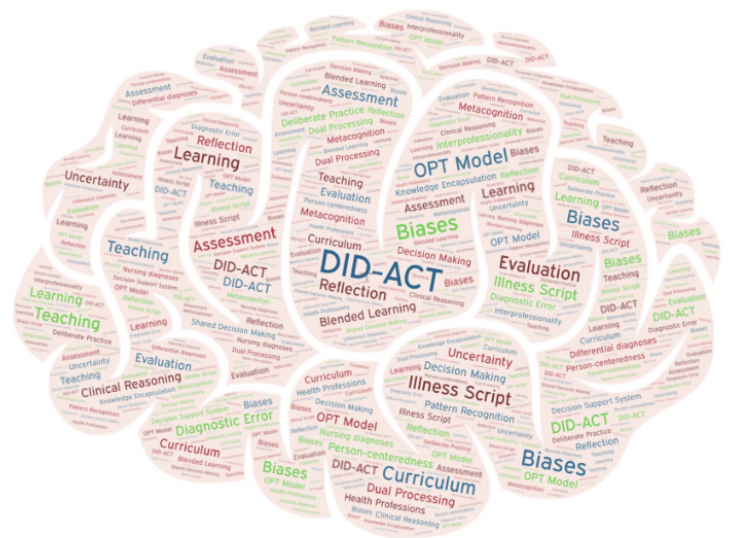
DID-ACT Information Leaflet

What is DID-ACT?

DID-ACT is a project to Develop, Implement and Disseminate an Adaptive Clinical Reasoning Curriculum for Tutors and Students. As an Erasmus+ funded project with an internationally diverse team including different health professionals, we managed to create two clinical reasoning curricula, one for educators and one for students. These curricula are comprehensive yet easily integrable and adaptable for all healthcare professions. It is completely free to use for anyone, including students, educators and educational institutions.

Our curriculum includes modern teaching methods and educational resources, such as videos, podcasts, quizzes, or virtual patients.

You can find the curriculum easily by creating a free account on our learning management platform at did-act.instruct.eu. You can also use Shibboleth to log in with your university credentials to freely access the curriculum.



How can I access the curriculum?

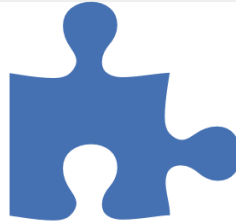
